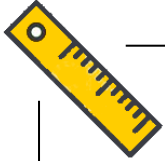


There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!

- Use an Ordnance Survey map of our local area to explore. What are the key features of the Ordnance Survey map? How do they help you navigate?
- Make a detailed pictorial map of your journey to school, including any key landmarks. For an extra challenge, can you estimate distance between key points on your map?
- Explore how technology has changed the way we navigate? Is it better, the same or worse? Why?

Reading

- Sink your teeth into a fiction crime series like *The Young Sherlock Holmes* series.
- Read books or conduct internet research about important historical figures such as Robin Hood and Dick Turpin.
- Research how maps are used on different terrains including water, air and land.

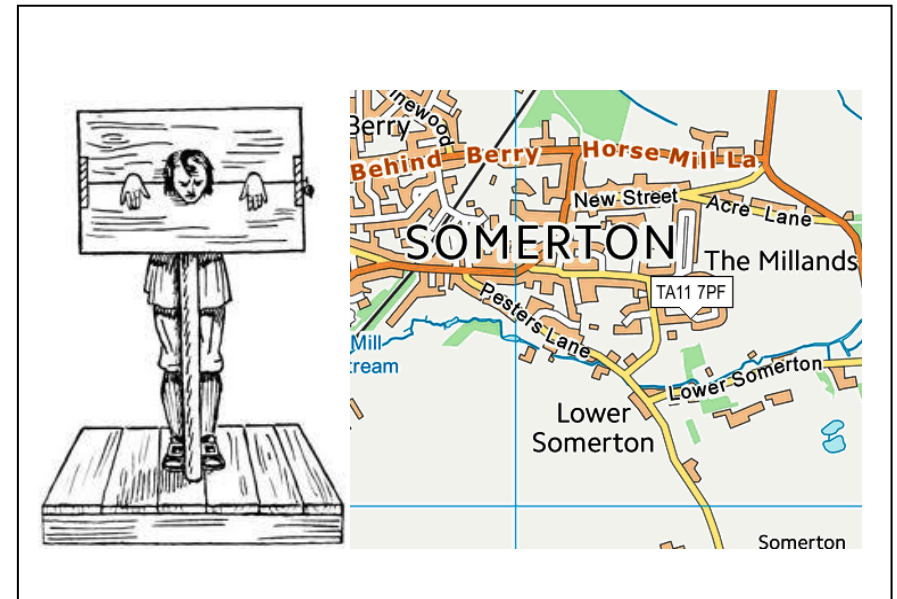

Some of the questions that we hope to answer this term.

In Geography

What are the key features of Ordnance Survey maps?
How do I use eight compass points to describe the routes on a map?
How do I use 4 and 6 figure grid references to locate places on a map?
How has land use changed over time?

In History

What did the Romans believe about crime and punishment?
How did the legal system work in Saxon Britain and how does it compare to today?
What were the popular methods of punishment in the Tudor period?
Who was Dick Turpin?
What was life like in Victorian prisons?

In Science

What are forces and how do they act on things?
What is gravity and how was it discovered?
What are the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction?
What are the key stages of a human's development?
How do babies grow and develop?

In RE

What is Agape?
How can we avoid being selfish and greedy?
How can we show compassion for others?
What did Jesus tell us about revenge and reconciliation?

Our Learning Journey

Our curriculum this term will be led by two areas of study: **Crime and Punishment** throughout history and **Marvellous Maps** in geography.

The Crime and Punishment unit – an area of social history – will develop the children's chronological knowledge beyond 1066. They will learn about a wide variety of aspects including the legacy of the Roman justice system and crime and punishment through the Anglo-Saxon, Tudor and Victorian periods. They will also deepen their historical awareness and understanding of how our past is constructed through studying the famous highwayman Dick Turpin. In conclusion, they will reflect upon and evaluate what they have learnt, as well as comparing modern day crime prevention and detection methods with those from the past.

Our topic of Marvellous Maps will provide the children with opportunities to further explore the range of maps available to geographers and to develop their understanding of the key features of maps. They will study a range of maps and atlases, including digital maps, and compare their features. They will have opportunities to use the eight compass points to give directions and give grid references to locate places on a map. By comparing maps of the same place, children will learn about the way that places have changed over time.
