- Visit local significant geographical or historical sites to discover why they are so great
- Enjoy non-fiction information texts and leaflets about the United Kingdom or towns and cities you may visit
- Read local and national geographical texts
- Share classical British children's literature and stories
- Find out about British myths and legends e.g. King Arthur's visit to Glastonbury
- Watch documentaries about the British Isles (e.g. train journeys by celebrities, nature programmes or other informative programmes such as Countryfile)
- Educational programmes that feature famous Britons throughout history
- Share a selection of UK maps together and search for towns or counties. Look at the courses of rivers, road networks and railway lines
- Visit the Rural Life Museum in Glastonbury
- Look for interesting things as you travel about in a vehicle and discuss what you notice about our land from the window



Our Learning Journey





We have launched our topic this term by exploring and familiarising ourselves with the country in which we live and discovering the definitions of the British Isles, Great Britain and the United Kingdom. The Year 6 and Year 5 children are already thoroughly engrossed in our book 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' which explores the plight of refugees and their journey to the UK.





We will also explore key UK topographical features - including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers.



The children will have the opportunity to discover and research land-use patterns and understand how some of these have changed over time.

In response to the concerns over climate change, we will be researching how the UK has responded to this and exploring ways in which our school and community can positively impact change. There will be elections for each class to have an Eco-Councillor.



Throughout the term, we will furthermore enjoy finding out about great British art and culture, food, music as well as great Britons — especially our own Queen Elizabeth II as she celebrates her Platinum Jubilee.



We are planning a 'Great British Bake Off' celebration at the end of term where the children will be encouraged to design and make cakes and biscuits which will enter a competition held at school. More details will follow later in the term.
