Our Learning Highlights

In the **Foundation Stage** this term we have had a wonderful term, jam-packed with lots of fun and engaging activities. In RE, the children have learnt all about special times and special places. The children have loved learning all about our local church and have very much enjoyed their special visit. We have had some fabulous superheroes from our community come into school to talk to the children about their job roles. This has really been wonderful for the children to experience. In Phonics, the children are working on consolidating their phase 3 sounds and tricky words. In maths, they have been learning all about mass and capacity, 6,7,8 and consolidating their knowledge of the basic 2D shapes..



Year 1 and 2 classes. In KS1 this half term we have been learning all about Castles, Knights and Dragons, exploring how castles have changed over time, the role of knights and how we can use historical sources to determine facts from myths. We have explored the stories of King Arthur and St George and the Dragon in English, and inspired by ferocious dragons, made our very own moving monsters as part of our DT topic.

Year 3 and 4 children have been studying Ancient Greece life, exploring the differences between the two city states of Athens and Sparta. They researched Alexander the Great, the Ancient Olympic Games and also looked at the legacies the Ancient Greeks left for the world. In English the children have been listening to Ancient Greek myths and then using



this knowledge to plan and write their own myths. In Year Three music the children have learnt songs about Ancient Greece, explored pulse and rhythm and have been singing in two parts. In design technology the children have made pneumatic toys based on Ancient Greek beasts. In year 4 the children have explored and designed Ancient Greek pottery.



Year 5 and 6 classes have been thoroughly enjoying reading 'Who Let the Gods Out' as a class and using the book to inspire some of our writing. We have learnt about formal and informal styles in letter and email form. Greek studies have been very enjoyable; learning about Alexander the Great, the empire, the Olympics as well as debating whether Athens or Sparta was the better city state.

Furthermore, we have been discovering lots of facts about Judaism in R.E. such as what happens during bar and bat mitzvahs, Rosh Hashanah and the meaning of kosher.
