We spent a lot of time in September helping the children to understand and remember our Golden Rules, discussing behaviours we should see if children are following the rules and behaviours that break the rules. We give a huge range of rewards to children who are following the Golden Rules throughout the week, culminating in Golden Time at the end of the week. Included in this is a half termly whole school reward for those children who have been following the Golden Rules consistently. Those children who have repeatedly broken the Golden Rules throughout the half term or who have received a yellow card will not be able to take part in the whole school reward.
