<u>Watching</u>

View nature programmes about oceans, seas and coasts such as Blue Planet I and II by David Attenborough.

Enjoy family seaside-themed films such as Finding Nemo, Finding Dory, Shark Tale and The Little Mermaid.

<u>Doing</u>

Take the opportunity to visit the nearby coastline or seaside and enjoy a walk and perhaps learn to skim a stone, search in rock pools for creatures, fly a kite, catch a fish in a net and jump over waves on the shore!

Make a scrapbook of lovely and interesting items that you collect on a seaside or coastal visit.

Find your own ideas for ways to create seaside art that you may be able to share with the class.

<u>Reading</u>

Read and discuss seaside poems.


The children could research information texts about seas and coastlines around the United Kingdom and the World. Find out about the lives and works of artists who have painted seaside scenes. After researching they could produce fact
