What have we been up to?

In the **Foundation Stage** this term we have been focussing on our topic theme 'All About Me'. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning about ourselves and our peers, discussing what makes us unique. In RE we were introduced to things that are special to us like family, favourite toy and special places. In Maths we have been sorting & matching patterns and have been practising recognising numbers to 10. In phonics we have learnt most of phase 2 sounds and tricky words. We have been practising recognising the initial sound of objects and trying to segment a word and blend it to read. Well done Pipits and Wagtails for a great start to your school journey!

Year 1 and 2 classes have enjoyed learning all about toys as their first history project. They have been comparing their modern toys to toys from the Victorian times. At the beginning of the half-term, children took part in a toy workshop delivered by Taunton Museum. This enabled the children to get hands on with old toys. They enjoyed playing with them and making their own zoetropes. The children are now looking forward to diving into Geography and studying our wonderful world! In Science, both Year 1 and 2 children have been studying everyday materials. The children have had chance to compare different materials, label their properties and discover which materials are suitable for different jobs. Drawing has been the focus in art this half-term. Year 1 have focused on mark making and observational drawings. Year 2 have developed drawing further and illustrated their own story books!

Year 3 and 4 children have been busy this term learning all about Ancient Egypt. This has included finding out about the importance of the River Nile, Ancient Egyptian pyramids and The Sphinx, maps of Egypt and where it sits on a globe or a map, hieroglyphics, gods and goddesses, mummification and Tutankhamun. We have also linked our fairy tale unit in English with our history work by studying an Egyptian version of our traditional Cinderella story, called The Egyptian Cinderella.

Year 5 and 6 classes have be learning how to use grammar features in our writing as well as getting to grips with place value and calculations in maths. There has been much deep thinking about God and Jesus in RE, superb art techniques using different media and poetry to create self-portraits and lots of interesting things to learn about the Ancient Egyptians. The children are retaining many facts about the Egyptian Empire.
