Thank you Mrs Hatt and David Walliams.

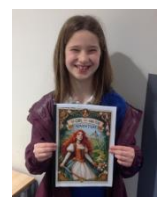


We are so lucky to have received lots of

illustrations.

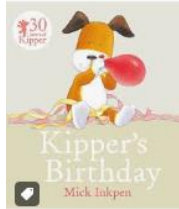
*'The story is about a girl who has

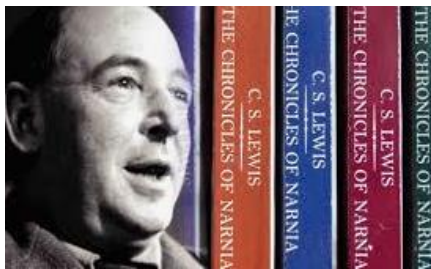
Year 3 have reading **One Dog and his Boy** by the author **Eva Ibbotson**.

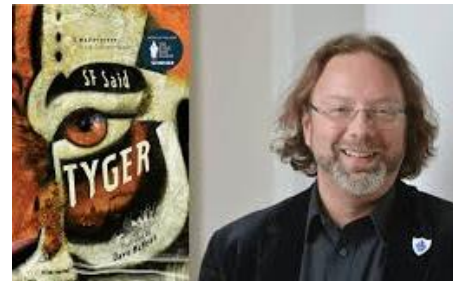
Year 4 and Year 5 have been reading **The Chronicles of Narnia – The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe** by CS Lewis
