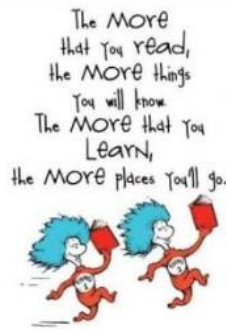


King Ina's Reading for Pleasure News Summer Term 1 2024

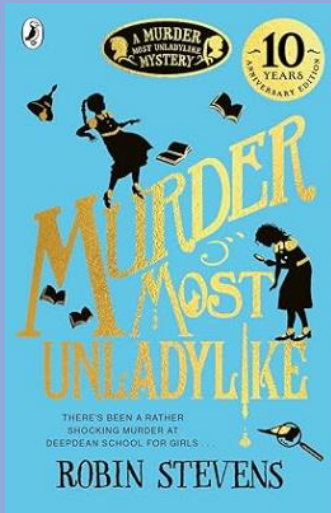

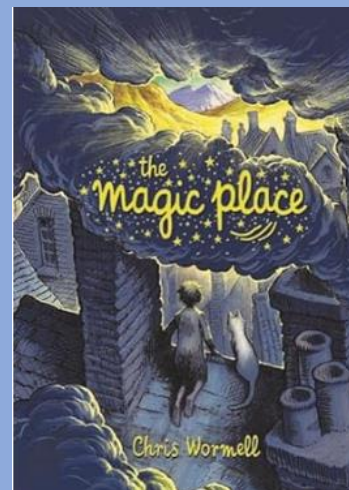

Bentley has been reading **Twelve days of Kindness** by **Cori Brooke**. “It is a great book about being kind to your friends. It has a really happy ending”.

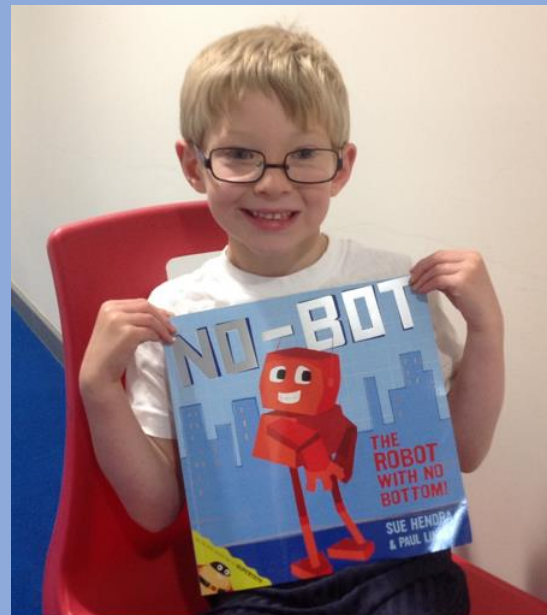
