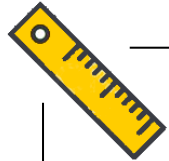


There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!

- Discuss what a traditional tale is. Do you have any at home you could read together?
- Talk about the stories you have read. Who are the characters? Where is the story set?



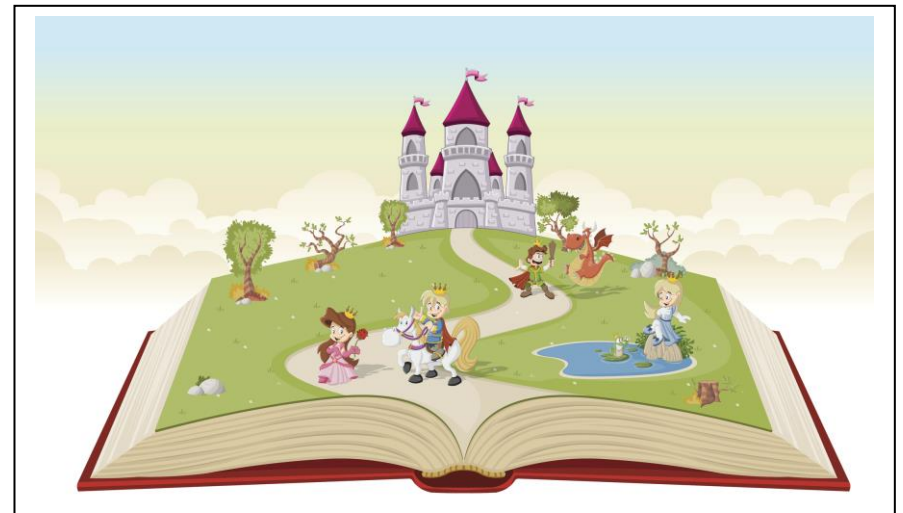

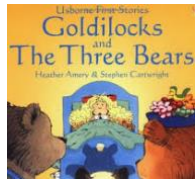

Important Information

Book bags, drinks and appropriate clothing: Please ensure your child comes to school every day with their book bag, drink and a coat. Children will need their book bags and reading books every day, to ensure that they can continue to practise their reading, sounds and tricky words with adults in the classroom.

Please can you check that jumpers, coats, hats, gloves etc. are clearly named and any pre-loved items have the previous owner's names removed.

Toileting: Please continue encouraging your child to use the toilet as independently as possible. Unless your child has a intimate care plan in place, staff are not able to help with wiping at school. We are always happy to talk children through the steps and offer reassurance, but it's the consistent practice and comfort of home that really builds confidence. If your child is prone to accidents, it would be really helpful to provide a set of spare clothes in their book bag as we have a very limited supply of spare clothes at school.
