
There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!

Steps to help your child succeed

- Read to and with your child every day.
- Please continue to help support your child with letter and number formations.
- Practise reading sound and word cards in your child's book bag wallet.
- Practise to recognise, order and count 1-10, both numbers and objects.
- Go to a local library; what traditional tales can you find?
- Discuss what a traditional tale is. Do you have any at home you could read together?
- Talk about the stories you have read. Who are the characters? Where is the story set?

Important Information

Spellings: The children have been doing really well with their spellings last term. Please continue to practise spellings at home and feel free to be as creative as you like. Ensure that you practise the spellings out of list order as that is how we practise them in school.

Book bags, drinks and appropriate clothing: Please ensure









your child comes to school every day with their book bag, drink and a coat. As the weather becomes warmer, please label any hats you may wish to bring. Children will need their book bags and reading books every day, to ensure that they can continue to practise their reading, sounds and tricky words with adults in the classroom.

Phonics Next Steps: The children have worked really hard on recalling all of their phase 2 and phase 3 sounds and tricky words. This term, we are moving onto Phase 4 which will introduce new tricky words and continue to reconsolidate their phase 3 sounds. The children will continue to build their confidence in writing sentences using their phonics knowledge and tricky words. Any support with this at home would be very much appreciated.
