What have we been up to?

This term the **Foundation Stage children** have worked hard in promoting all areas of their development, to support their learning. In PE, the children have worked on their spatial awareness, balance, and coordination. In RE, they have enjoyed learning about, retelling, and performing The Christmas Story. They all worked so hard in producing two wonderful nativity performances, we are very proud of them all! The children have continued to build on their knowledge of numbers in mathematics and are enjoying exploring writing through a variety of different media.

Year 1 and 2 classes have enjoyed learning all about The Great Fire Of London this half term. They were amazing at remembering facts! They ended their learning by rotating around the KS1 classrooms and completing different art and craft activities linked to The Great Fire Of London. There were some lovely Tudor houses and London silhouettes. They linked this with learning about fire safety and how to stay safe around fire. We ended the term with an amazing Nativity! The children loved acting and singing! We can't wait to dive into our Geography topic next term. Out topic is called What's On The Menu? We will be comparing Mexico to the UK.

This half term **years 3 and 4** have been studying The Tudors - focusing on the Tudor Monarchs and the wives of Henry VIII. The children chose their own area of interest and used ICT to research this area and then published their research in their own words using Google.Docs. Both year groups explored Tudors in our local area by becoming historical detectives and following a Tudor Trail around Somerton, discovering more about the past of the area we live in.

Upper Key Stage 2 children have loved discovering more about Tudor England and the royal family history. They know lots of facts about those times. We have explored the Tudor history of Somerton and its buildings on a special trail. We have been working on stories and improving our description in English and are currently using devices and Lego to create a micro:bit unit which can be used to monitor temperatures in an animal cage.

Christmas Celebrations

We have had a great time in school this last two weeks celebrating Christmas. Thank you to those of you who came along to our EYFS and KS1 Nativity performances and the KS2 Carol Concert.

I am sure you will all agree that the children performed brilliantly whether they were singing, acting or performing bible readings.

Specific praise... labelled

Social Learning Theory – new behaviours can be learnt by observing and imitating others (bandura)

Use of rewards – after the event (bribes come before), smart and cheap


The session will be fully collaborative, and we will be open to conversations and listening to your own techniques which have been successful.
