Our Learning Journey

This first half term we will be finding out about significant women in history through our history topic. We will compare female monarchs from different eras such as Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria. After this we shall be looking at female nurses including Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. Through looking at all of these significant individuals we shall be identifying the impact that they have had on society.

In the second half term we shall be moving onto our geography topic called Magical Mapping. It will begin by looking at directional language such as near, far, left, right, north, south, east and west. We will be looking at maps of the UK and the world, using these to identify continents and oceans of the world. We shall be looking at maps in depth, using the them to identify features in our local area. They shall create their own basic maps using symbols and keys and use these to plan a route of our local area.
